Discussion:

Nick Ferarra: We have a 10 hour business meeting, there was a deadline and that wasn't met, so all of us as student government leaders, we don't do that when we are passing resolutions. We do that in workshops and through networking. We need to be passing things that we can bring back to our campuses and our constituencies.

12: I want to comment on what he said, I know a lot of us who are leaders, would you tell a student "I'm sorry you missed a deadline to make your voice heard?" As student leaders you are entitled to voice your opinion, we have a right to be heard.

20: I agree with what you said and networking, if someone has something they should bring to the table then we should do work because that is what we are here for.

107: I'm opposed. I was wondering why we even have a deadline if we are going to allow it?

Vice President Doyle: Last year you will remember there were a lot of resolutions that our constituency couldn't view prior to coming and they vote on them without their bodies, but didn't have time to approve them on their campuses. That is why we have the deadline so we can take that into consideration.

93: I am in favor--again while I do support what Nick said with deadlines, not only are we students, and if all of these had been submitted before the deadline we would have reviewed them no question, but we should at least hear from the authors why they wrote the resolutions.

Ferarra: If someone brought me something at Binghamton I would absolutely meet with them, but I would not put forward something before a body....if we talked about everything on the earth we could accomplish more important things.

OLD BUSINESS

1617-051 Committee Quorum

This is a proposed by law change to allow us to meet quorum within our meetings to be more productive and get things done.

President Cohen: I wanted to expand our committees this year, such that we could conduct business without directors having to stall their progress. We are not in any way decreasing transparency.

Motion to approve 1617-051 by 82, seconded by 89

Discussion:

Arthur: I strongly oppose this resolution. Additionally I think that while we have seen more students join the committees, if you aren't going to show up regularly, then maybe you shouldn't be a voting delegate on the committee.

Point of Parliamentary Inquiry: In judgment of the chair, is it legal for us to introduce this resolution and if so why?

President Cohen: I think the Board of Trustees would look favorably upon this resolution and I will articulate why this is a necessary step....thanks for the question.

66: Hello everybody my name is Mike Braun, when I first got elected Marc told me about all of the opportunities to join committees so I reached out to as many people as I know. You have to set expectations because they are representing your college and your sga. It's not like they have an agenda they want to push forward. Rey Muniz for example....it



is our duty to elect people who will put checks and balances on the chairmen. With this policy we will be able to get more things done.

31: I am opposed--hello everyone so when we brought this to our SGA, students at Purchase didn't agree with it ...just doesn't seem right.

97: Hi everybody I am the Director of Academic Affairs, but I am here to discuss Suny Old Westbury's opinion on the matter. I think we need to proceed with our resolutions and not get blocked with committee members not showing up. I think it should be 20% of committee membership is quorum on committees.

97 motion to amend resolution to 20% of membership makes quorum for committees, seconded by 69

Arthur: While I think that is a step in the right direction, I think that it would have to be further amended because if there is a committee that only has four members than 1 member would make quorum. I think it should be if the number is above a certain number than it is 20% but below it is three.

62: Point of information, where is this number of three coming from?

President Cohen: I sat on a committee and saw that in order to push things through we determined that three people would be sufficient.

62: Follow-up question, what was the committee?

107: I will admit I'm on those committees and can't always make it, it is on the members of the comm who are not showing up, if you want a say then you need to show up

point of clarification: arthur= there are also provisions in Article 17 that allows Chairs to remove members who are not showing up to their meetings, at discretion of chair (except for reps)

1: opposed it is always hard to get people to join these committees and it makes it easier to get people involved in SUNY SA, but making it 20%the whole thing, it doesn't matter how the committee works....

20: thank you, what I am having a hard time getting my head around is, why if no matter what the committee decides, why is there a purpose for committees? if the problem is having people attend the committees, select people who actually want to do work

1617-052 Bylaw Revision – Article VIII (Committees)

Arthur: Hi everyone it is Arthur again. This is a relatively straightforward resolution, standing committees....this proposed resolution would keep Rules, Community Colleges, and State Operated Campuses as the three standing committees. This has been discussed by EC twice and has been passed by Rules a third time; it will streamline our operations.

97 motion to approve 1617-052, seconded by 20

Discussion:

61: Can we clean up the language in the second whereas?

Cohen: lit is a grammatical thing?

101: Leave that at total discretion of president, I trust that there are ad-hoc committees there now that someone could say are not important, and I think it is a dangerous precedent to set.

30: I do want to say I am in opposition to this because I didn't know government relations was struck out and it is critical to be included and getting rid of it is not something our campus could support.

Cohen: yield to Rey

Muniz: Hi I'm Director of Legislative Affairs, let's eliminate it. It should not be a standing



committee...when you move into spring semester, the committee can often times strike you down, please vote in favor of this.

66: Question for Arthur, the reason I like the committee is because it does grasp the ideas and perspectives of outsiders of SUNY SA, how can you guarantee that...?

Arthur: These are specifically designed to be harder to change, the EC as a group felt that these three were essential to the basic operations of the organizational structure; along with

amendments to by-laws; there is a safeguard we trust incoming administration knows what they are doing with a new structure, the reason why removing government relations; as Rey mentioned that sometimes it is essential to have that committee and sometimes it slows down the work and progress of the committee.

Cohen: To summarize the President can affirm whatever he or she sees fit, we have had sub-committees and just because they are not listed doesn't mean.

1: Strongly in favor and giving more discretion as to how this works, we have a lot of debate on by-laws changes; i don't see anything helping the students we represent by changing the by-laws.

30: I still remain opposed to this resolution because of the structure of government relations, it is just re-writing the by-laws to address this issue. At times it can be very difficult for SUNY Central to reach out and this is in no way trying to bash the current administration; if there is an issue with the soundboard...we should make the by-laws more flexible, we can change them so that we can do this.

Arthur: Government relations does very important work and many of their members care what we have to say, let's not make it a mandatory committee because it is not integral to the structure.

101: Rey you changed my mind and I call to question.

1617-068 Safety and Support of Undocumented Students

Conner: Good afternoon everyone. I'm going to give a brief overview of what this

resolution is calling for.

Cohen: I'm going to give the Chair to Bridget.

Conner: Here are the other co-authors: Omar who majors in biochemistry at Oswego, Vrinda from Plattsburgh and am Rob Drumm, I've been here too long. We are excited to bring this to conference today and the dozens of students who helped draft this resolution to present today.

Omar: The actual is to...undocumented international students and having been signed by more than fifty of our campuses, more than 5,100 students signed this petition for undocumented students to affirm their safety. We are here to call on the Board of Trustees to not allow on our campuses without a warrant; to refuse campus police to enforce police interrogation, etc.; support in-state tuition rates to students with DACA statuses. What this is is that they have to support undocumented international students and make sure that all 64 campuses abide by this; knowing that my university has those policies and will protect me, which SUNY values its mission statement and pursue my education.

Vrinda: We have students from 65 countries, we passed a resolution in our senate and exec board, and we presented to faculty senate and university senate. We would like to affirm and extend that no matter what religion and you identify with...them agreeing with this resolution just affirms and reinstates our belief in the SUNY system.

Bridget stepped down as chair and Marc took spot as chair

Conner: This resolution...time and time again as the SUNY Board of Trustees have said the SUNY to be an inclusive institution. The State University of New York is to provide the same opportunities to all students; education is a basic human right that should be accessible to everyone. The Board of Trustees has outlined policies to protect this right, but we are calling on the Board of Trustees to sign on with this petition.

102 motion to approve 1617-068, seconded by 32

Discussion:

97: Jeanette informed me that she has been in contact with all of authors of this resolution and that we passed this in our general assembly. It is important to every campus, regardless of who you are.



48: I am student trustee at SUNY Broome, I took an oath to support the constitution, which is why at SUNY Broome we passed a welcoming resolution in past month.

9: Henry--thank you for your work on this resolution, WCC fully supports this resolution. We are a very diverse community college, and I was proud to sign a resolution two months ago that fully supports the efforts of this bill. I am in full support of it.

32: I've seen a lot of sanctuary campus bills over the last 8 months, this is something we have discussed on my campus and many places, I feel the room is in support.

1617-82 Budget Request & Financial Plan

Pat: Can everyone hear me? So this resolution was presented to EC at Schenectady. It represents a comprehensive plan; it passed before state budget passed which still officially has not. What it asks for is however much money the state allocates to system wide student govts, we want SUNY to bump that as much as they can; which was cut by 2% this year. It is incredibly inadequate to fund us and asks SUNY to give us as much money as they possibly can. It outlines a plan for SUNY to work with SUNY SA to work to increase budget as much as possible; it is a very complex structure and it is calling on SUNY to give us a major increase in funding this next upcoming year and for funding for the upcoming years to increase our budget drastically for upcoming years to years. It was unanimously passed by our EC; the numbers laid out in this; It is mostly non-committal and we are asking SUNY to give us as much money as they possibly can which is where our budget comes from, and despite them reaching an agreement in the



last hour or so, it has not officially passed; this gives reason for why we need a drastic increase in funding and call count them to work with us on the upcoming year and plus; work on the mission we are tasked with. It would be great if we had adequate funding to be more visible on your campuses and make sure you have the resources you need to advocated on a state level; that is what this resolution calls for, so that we may become a strong advocacy organization in the state the number of students we represent; just to lay out what the budget process looks like; the suny bot passes a budget which goes to executive branch in november which is passed and presented in January; then three month long process where budget is worked out and passed and from there, they go through a department level process, that hasn't started yet for this year; SUNY student assembly finds out what they... it's is a long process and we need to be out in front of it and drastically increase our budget; over the budget request process, when we will request s larger budget. Our finances are small in amount but any questions?

101 motion to approve 1617-82, second by 97

Discussion:

31: Point of information: how does the budget currently work and how does it currently work now?

Pat: The way that process works is that the suny board of trustees works to... SUNY SA is lined in that budget request and we are by far the smallest line, which is offensive in my opinion. Negotiates with the governor on the final state budget, which it seems like either tonight or tomorrow that that is going to happen; we go through a budget process to ask SUNY to give us an increase as much as they possibly can where system wide student government; there are limitations on how much they can move around money based on what was passed in state budget; going to go into a phase where....we are going to try to get in early on the next round and ask for an increase next year; separate from our research account; we pay upfront costs for

- **18**: My name is Imran Suhail and I would like to say I sat in at the meeting and I think that this is a great idea.
- **97**: I was also at that meeting, we have the lowest funding suny program and the next lowest is approx \$500,000 which is a big difference; it would allow representatives to attend their campuses, yield to Muniz.

Muniz: This was the result of an incredible process and many people were brought into this process; this is going to put next year's Treasurer and Director of Legislative Affairs in a strong position for advocacy.

Discussion:

93: Opposed to postponing, we already approved the agenda and this resolution has been looked at by at least three dozen people since fall conference.

Majority Opposed

Doyle: Talked about what the subcommittee did; more input and feedback on what this resolution does and changed it around entirely; culmination of your thoughts and what you want to see SUNY SA adopt; last five months since fall conference.

Danny: Basically we are back at this again, we have gone through the stipulations of what the Student Assembly wanted, we made very progressive movements in the resolution...a parent who didn't have a student who attended that college, it made them feel uncomfortable; we have done everything that the body asked us to do.

Doyle: Called for in the fall to adopt a formal partnership; we decided that in any situation that it is inappropriate for suny sa to formally align with any movement, not because we disagree with this movement; calls for SUNY SA to battle systemic racism and police brutality on their campuses.

18 motion to approve 1617-FC03, seconded by 62

Discussion:

7: I want to say that I think the resolution is great and you mentioned we wouldn't feel



comfortable affixing SUNY SA's resolution.... we should change the title.

Danny: A potential resolved that this document in no way affiliates the organization of SUNY SA to the political affiliations that the Black Lives Matter movement does, other than the fact that we mutually agree that Black Lives matter, police brutality is wrong, and we should start calling on the New York State government to start looking to reforming their criminal justice laws so that everyone has a fair chance to making a happy life here.....

31 motion to amend seconded by 7

98: I want to say I appreciate all the hard work that you guys put into this and some time has passed since this was originally brought up; please don't forget what it felt like the first time was brought up.

1617-SC01 SGA Listserv Accessibility

Presented by Alex George and Nicole Pereira on behalf of State Ops Committee **George**: Campus presidents have access to listervs to send out information, we believe that sga presidents should have the same access in order to keep their student informed and participation in general.

Nicole: Our committee felt that a campus email from a president is just as important and we want it to be as accessible as possible.

George: It is very important that these emails not to be censored by administration.

Braun: potential of SUNY SA is,... encouraging...increasing financial literacy to individual campuses to talk about not only the importance of shared governance...our reps going regionally; we don't have funding for reps to go to their campuses and use the resources available to help internal workings of the student government associations; there a lot of positives that; we are representing the students across the system; if we can go out and....

Ostro: SUNY SA needs a large budget increase which we can accomplish through fundraising...allowing for travel for representative to their campuses and better legislative advocacy. We need to be able to compete on a statewide level and get our foot in the door with legislation and we can make that possible with better funding...I have a strategic plan on your table for all of you.

20: Each of you says we need to fix the budget, all I hear is we need to pay the EC more money, off the backs of the students when you are to advocate for the rights of students. How do you justify charging the students so that you can do your jobs as opposed to finding the funding resources to do this?

Delgado: A long term proposal ... main goal to increase our fundraising...send representatives to campuses and have more engaged legislative advocacy.

Braun: I don't think stipends is a priority, being involved in unions, right now the issues that we are facing, whether it is the federal or state branch, it is something that is a full time job; those incentives only encourage us to work harder to advocate for the issues and SUNY SA should be compensated for higher education across the state... we will work as hard as we can to lobby for higher ed across the system.

Ostro: Like I said on the last ...I've heard all of this conversation about creating a fee, which is a huge process; we need to grow our budget through suny admin and take the money and put it back into student programming; we spend our entire budget on EC meetings and conferences; we should be independent and focus on this type of programming and be the connector for our system; we are failing in that mission.

95: It is easy to ask for more money, but hard to determine what to do with that money, I want to test your financial literacy, what would you do if SUNY decided right now that they would give us 1 million dollars for advocacy, what would you do with that money?



Braun: Needs to be relationship with SUNY Administration, create...combined effort towards advocacy efforts of our student government associations.

Ostro: I would take \$900,000 and put it in a bank account and not touch it, overnight we can't implement and need to gradually; we don't have institutional infrastructure to manage such a large budget; gradually increasing our budget while investigating feedback about the fee as a responsible way to grow our budget and that is what I am committed to.

Delgado: I would hire a lawyer first thing; I ensure that our partnership with the SUNY student life office was strong; accept how that funding; gradually implement it over the years; dehydrating and killing the Student Assembly.

104: How would you separate your own interests and political agenda from serving the student body and represent your constituents?

Ostro: We represent diverse interests and how does Treasurer play into it? May not seem like a position that comes off the board and they are an influential opinion in decision making process; we should orient all of our policy making around student interests and we should limit ourselves to some degree... and I know that that is vague but I shouldn't of the bat be deciding what our elements.

Delgado: The budget is in itself its own policy issue and finances and numbers don't have political motives; in regards to that i sitting on the E-board...the overall thing is that I need to get an increased budget, and while I will be... my job is to make sure the budget is handled appropriately and effectively.

Braun: I work for the students and not for myself, but for each one of you; I would develop a committee to get information for CFOs from all campuses to get input that I could use as CFO; with the Exec Order from Trump on Immigration ban, we openly opposed the ban; we had an advocacy day where we called out representatives



because it impacted directly over 300 students across the SUNY System; I am going to use each one of you as a resource to do so.
